



SEEDS TO SEW INTERNATIONAL

‘STUDENT AMBASSADOR INTERNSHIP PROGRAM’

High school and college students are invited to submit their application to become Seeds to Sew Student Ambassadors. Our goal is to have students gain knowledge about the challenges women and girls face in developing countries and get involved in our programs. We want our Seeds to Sew Student Ambassadors to become invested in our mission and operations, participating in activities to raise awareness and promote our Enkiteng Giving Bags and Enkisoma Beads of Hope projects.

Seeds to Sew Student Ambassadors will be involved in educating their classmates and community about the status of women and girls in compromised areas. In addition to educating others, Seeds to Sew Student Ambassadors will be involved with marketing our products and promoting local activities to market them in order to provide income to the participants in our programs. Seeds to Sew Student Ambassadors may also take on projects associated with their own field of interest.

- The Student Ambassador would agree to commit for a one year-term (two semesters).
- Ambassadors would agree to champion and support the women and girls in our programs by taking the initiative to create activities or join other campus initiatives to raise awareness about the status of women and girls in impoverished communities.
- Ambassadors would agree to host a Seeds to Sew event each semester and will take an active role in promoting the event within their school community.
- Ambassadors would agree to work with teachers, professors and other program coordinators to arrange for a Seeds to Sew director to speak to a class, a student or community organization, or at a school function in support of service learning initiatives.
- Ambassadors would agree to attend at least one Seeds to Sew sponsored event ie: Kakenya at Princeton, or Craft Fair Booth, High School collaboration, fundraiser, etc.
- Ambassadors would agree to raise awareness about the Student Ambassador program with the aim of introducing students from other schools into the program, by linking to student leadership programs, community events, social media, etc.
- Ambassadors may also contribute based on their skills, talents and interests
- Student Ambassadors (and their family members) receive first priority for joining Seeds to Sew on service trips to Kenya; as well as first priority for summer internships working in the field with program operations.
- While the internship is unpaid, Seeds to Sew will provide documentation as required to support school-credit programs, as well as provide letters of reference for college, grad school or job applications.
